

Free Income Tax Preparation for Deaf and Hard of Hearing Tax Payers at NVRC!



DeafTax.com VITA Pilot

If you worked in 2009 and earned less than \$45,000, then you might qualify for free assistance with preparing your simple tax return.

NVRC is working with DeafTax.com and the Real Economic Impact Tour to offer free income tax preparation for deaf or hard of hearing tax payers who use American Sign Language, through the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program.

Using the videophone at NVRC, deaf or hard of hearing tax payers will communicate directly with IRS Certified VITA volunteers to prepare their simple tax returns.

This service is now available **by appointment only** until April 15, 2010.

There is no cost for the service.

What to bring to your appointment:

- Photo ID.
- Social Security cards or ITIN letters and birthdates for the taxpayer, spouse and dependents.
- If married and filing a joint return, both spouses must be present.
- Wage and earnings statements: W-2, W-2G, and all Form 1099s received.
- Unemployment compensation, Form 1099G.
- Interest and dividend statements.
- Day care expenses paid in 2009 and the day care provider's name, address and federal ID number.
- Student loan interest payments.
- Record of tuition or student loan payments, 1098-E.
- A copy of last year's federal and state returns (if available)
- A check or deposit slip if you want direct deposit.
- Record of any Sales Tax paid on new vehicles purchased in 2009.
- Record of any Real Estate Taxes paid in 2009.
- Record of any Economic Recovery Payment received from SSA, RRB or Veterans Administration.
