





Full name: Charles Edward Drawdy Nickname: Eddie

Where were you born? South Carolina

Where have you lived the longest? I would say the northern VA area.

Were you born Deaf? I was born hearing. For reasons unknown, I lost most of my hearing around age of 6 or 7, during second grade. I didn't get sick but the doctor labeled it as nerve deafness.



Did you come from a Deaf family or a family with all Hearing members?

My family were all hearing. I was the first to become deaf at a young age.

Did you attend the State School for the Deaf or regular public school?

After I became deaf, my mother discovered a deaf school (SCSDB) for me to attend.

If you attended the State School for the Deaf, where was it located?

I went to South Carolina School for the Deaf and Blind in Spartanburg, SC.

What was your favorite subject in high school and why?

I loved Social Studies and Science. I love to watch and study people or human behaviors and Social Studies was related to that. I was fascinated about science because it explains a lot about the mysteries around us.

What activities did you participate in after school (clubs, sports, cheerleading, etc.)?

I was more of a bookworm than a sports person. I also was a day student so I did not stay on campus to participate in anything.

Did you attend college after graduating from high school? If so, where? What was your degree? I went to Gallaudet and obtained my degree in General Business.

If married, how did you meet your spouse? I was married once. My wife and I decided to part ways due to different interests. We have two wonderful kids. Our daughter is an athletic trainer for high school sports. She is married to a Marine, so they relocate often across the country. My son is currently working on his Ph.D. at California State University in Berkeley.

Are you still working or are you retired? If working, where do you work and what is your occupation? I retired in 2020 from Gallaudet University after working for 38 years in the IT department.

Pineapple Cake

Ingredients:

1/2 cup and 2 tbsp sweetened condensed milk

2 cups flour

1/4 cup sugar

2 Tsp soda

1 20 oz can crushed pineapple with juice

1 Tsp vanilla

1/2 cup nuts, chopped

Directions:

Mix eggs, sugar, flour, soda, pineapple (including juice), vanilla, and nuts. Pour into greased and floured sheet cake pan. Baked at 350 degrees for 20-30 minutes.

DON'T OVERBAKE! (Top will have no white spots and sides will pull away from pan)



Frosting:

8 oz. cream cheese

1/2 stick margarine

1 3/4 cups powdered sugar

1 Tsp vanilla

1/2 cup nuts, chopped

Directions:

Mix cream cheese, margarine, powdered sugar, vanilla, and nuts. Spread over warm cake.
