DeSanto Centre for the Deaf



DeSanto Centre for the Deaf is based in Livingstone, Zambia. It was established because there is not enough educational resources for the over 250 Deaf adults and children. DeSanto provides education tailored to Deaf students, including two healthy meals a day, and transportation to and from school for each student. Lisa Zahra is the Founder/Director of DEAAF and The DeSanto Centre for the Deaf (one and the same). She has been volunteering for 20+ years. Her teachers are dedicated and committed in continuing to teach their Deaf students.



Funds needed:

DeSanto is in dire straits as its funding has come to a screeching halt. DeSanto wants to continue its work and provide for the community. For donations, see: https://kidsofk.org/donations/desanto/. The parents are pleading with DeSanto to remain open, because DeSanto has helped the Deaf children excel in many ways. The teachers have not been paid for almost two months now. It could be more than that if DeSanto does not get additional funds.
