





Peanut Butter Chocolate Chip Cookies by Barbara Eger-Klatt

Peanut butter lovers will enjoy the rich pure flavor of peanuts in these cookies. For variety, you can substitute another nut butter, such as almond or cashew butter, or add 1/2 cup of semisweet chocolate chips to the batter.

- * 3/4 cup creamy peanut butter
- * 1/2 cup vegan margarine
- * 1/2 cup sugar
- * 1/3 cup maple syrup
- * 3 tablespoons pure vanilla extract
- * 2 1/2 cups all-purpose flour
- * 1 tsp baking powder
- * 1/4 tsp salt

In a large bowl, combine the peanut butter, margarine, sugar, maple syrup, water, and vanilla. Mix until well blended. Add the flour, baking powder, and salt. Stir well for a smooth dough. Cover and chill until firm, about 1 hour.

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. Roll out the dough on a lightly floured work surface to a 1/4 inch thickness. Cut into shapes with cookie cutters or the rim of a small drinking glass. Use a metal spatula to transfer the cookies to an ungreased baking sheet.

Baked until lightly browned at the edges, 8 to 10 minutes. Cool the cookies slightly before transferring to a wire rack to cool completely. Store in an airtight container.

Ingredients:

- * 2 1/4 cups All-purpose flour
- * 1 tsp ground cinnamon
- * 1/2 tsp baking soda
- * 1/4 tsp salt
- Whisk the mix first in a medium bowl.

Add:

- * 3/4 cup unsalted butter (softened)
- * 3/4 cup granulated sugar
- Mix both on high speed for 2 minutes.

Add:

- * 1 large egg
- * 1 1/2 tsp pure vanilla

Mix for one minute. Bake in oven for 9 minutes at 350 degrees.

Buy icing from a grocery store — any color. You can top the icing with rainbow sprinkles.

Community Health Worker (CHW)

The National Association of Community Health Workers defines the Community Health Worker as "an umbrella term and includes community health representatives, promotors, peers and other workforce members who are frontline public health professionals that share life experience, trust, compassion, cultural and value alignment with the communities where they live and serve".

The mission is to "Unify the voices of the community health workers and strengthen the profession."

How did I became a CHW?

In March 2023, Gallaudet announced a CHW Workshop open to the Deaf Community. I attended the two-day workshop. It explained how to become a CHW. You check <u>NACHW.org</u> for the list of CHW classes in your home state. It lists accredited community college or university courses that are available. It is a public health field.

CHW focused on six pillars:

- % CHWs are a unique workforce. It is one of a kind.
- % CHWs are a community-based workforce
- ☆ CHWs are a historic and diverse workforce
- ℁ CHWs are a cross-section workforce
- % CHWs are a proven workforce
- % CHWs are a precarious workforce
