### Strengthening Our Regional Ampact

This year, we deepened our role as a trusted resource supporting Deaf, Hard of Hearing, DeafBlind, Late-Deafened individuals, seniors aging into hearing loss, technology users, sign language interpreters, educators, families, and partners.

#### **NVRC** continues to provide:

- \* Free hearing screenings and one-to-one peer mentoring
- \*Access to our technology demonstration room, featuring assistive listening devices, captioned phones, alerting systems, and visual smoke detectors
- \* Support for cochlear implant users and people with tinnitus
- \* Training for professionals, caregivers, employers, and first responders
- \* Virtual programs that increased connection for those unable to attend in person

NVRC's staff are the heartbeat of our mission — educators, mentors, outreach specialists, and coordinators who bring decades of lived experience, compassion, and personal connection to every interaction. Their commitment allows us to show up, build trust, and serve with purpose.

# Interpreter Services and access



Our Interpreter Service strengthened this year while remaining one of the most affordable in the region. We proudly launched our first *Interpreter Appreciation Day* and began developing mentorship opportunities and professional training — including a future CEU Classes and a ProTactile workshop to expand access for DeafBlind residents.

Our donor-supported **Communication Access Fund** ensured individuals and organizations could receive interpreting or CART services when cost was a barrier. For many, it was a *lifeline to communication when it mattered most*.
